Over the past century, more than half of the world's forests have been lost due to slash-and-burn agriculture, a method used to clear land for cultivation. This approach has contributed to increased atmospheric CO2 levels. By adopting sustainable agricultural practices such as Farming God's Way, farmers are learning to restore land for productive cropping while also promoting the role of trees in air purification. Researchers at Kansas State University have observed that U.S. farmers who apply manure and compost to their fields, rather than chemical fertilizers, are improving soil quality and enhancing its capacity to capture CO2 molecules. Lowering CO2 levels in the air.



The design is simple but effective. The filter is easily maintained and easy to operate. It is easily adaptable to any application whether a pond, river, or well. It is one of several ways to provide clean water.

Martin's church in Ghana emphasizes the message of salvation. Recently, a BLW water filter and a new well were installed, providing reliable access to clean water for the community. As a result, both spiritual and physical needs are being met, contributing to the growth of the congregation.



The Farm Haiti Mission has been instrumental in instructing local communities in Haiti on the Farming God's Way method. Both in the classroom or in the field they are taught of God's mercy and abundance.



Trainees receive instruction both in classroom settings and during practical fieldwork, focusing on the application of principles derived from the teachings associated with Adam and Eve's stewardship of the garden. The curriculum also includes guidance on how to combat spiritual forces that have been holding them down.

Better Living Water installed a filter at the Vida Christian Academy and clinic in Honduras even though they have their own well and are hooked up to the city water supply both are contaminated. We set up a watering station to fill individual and water dispenser bottles. This station now meets the needs of water for 170 students plus the staff daily.



Public health should be regarded as an integral aspect of comprehensive healthcare. Many of the villages we work in are in rural areas where clinics are not available.



An integral component of our comprehensive strategy is ensuring access to education. When clinic personnel visit the village, they are accompanied by educators who support the ongoing academic development of local children.
